Takashi Ariga, Waseda University

Akiko lida is a Japanese urbanist and researcher. Her research examines how to reduce disaster risks and enhance well-being by urban green infrastructure. She also practices various urban planning projects through collaboration with local municipalities. lida received a PhD from Department of Urban Engineering, The University of Tokyo in 2012 and is now working as a project assistant professor for the Master's Program in Sustainable Urban Regeneration at The University of Tokyo.

Takashi Ariga is Professor of Architecture and Urban Design, Associate Dean of the School of Science and Engineering at Waseda University in Tokyo. His research and practice are focused on "Machizukuri" as a type of community-based urban design and planning, environmental and visual simulation for public design communication, and cross-cultural comparative analyses of urban forms and transformation. His major works include *Urban Planning International Terminology Dictionary, The Community Building Design Process*, and *Karatsu: Urban Reorganization Making an Attractive Town*.
