Practices of Transnational Dwelling between 'Remittance Urbanism' and 'Extractive Tourism'



## **ABSTRACT**

The tourist and the migrant are symbolic figures of modernity. Their movements are among the most powerful forces of transformation of cities and territories. Today these movements give rise to new neocolonial phenomena, drawing strength from new conditions. In this seminar are presented some outputs of a research on transnational dynamics that manifest themselves in a small pueblo of the Ecuadorian Andes, Vilcabamba, and the socio-spatial modifications they trigger.

The concepts of 'extractive zone' and 'remittance urbanism', are used as operative tools for spatial research. One of the outputs of this research is the construction of a discourse about urbanism as a discipline of relationship.



## BIOGRAPHY

Antonio di Campli is Assistant Professor in Urban Planning at the Polytechnic of Turin after having taught and done research in various universities in Europe and Latin America. He is coordinator of the University research projects entitled 'Transiciones Territoriales' at the Pontificia Universidad Javeriana of Bogotá and 'Rural-Urban Interface', at the Universidad Católica of Cuenca.

His researches focus on urban and territorial restructuring processes and uneven spatial development in non-Western contexts. Author of monographs and research articles, he has produced studies on post-colonial urban phenomena translated into multiple languages.

His latest books are: Challenging the Lettered City. Antagonist Forms of Urbanism in Latin America, 2017; Densificar la ciudad. Cuestiones, problemas y diseño urbano en Ecuador, 2016.
