The presentation will be structured around passages that explore my own situatedness as 'other,' reflect on 'othering' practices linked to murder and extraction practices in Colombia, and suggest collaborative platforms and feminist practices as resources for decolonising architectural pedagogy. The talk asks: What if difference was instrumentalised not in processes of 'othering' that refer to asymmetrical power, systemic inequality, oppression and inequity, but instead in processes of 'commoning'?

Catalina Mejía Moreno is Lecturer of Architectural Humanities and Director of Humanities at the School of Architecture of the University of Sheffield. Her diverse interests are situated at the intersections of architectural history, material, cultural and media studies, critical theory, feminist theory and decolonial thought.
