'оsmosis' NATURE SWAPPED AND NATURE LOST: Biodiversity Offsetting, Urbanization and Social Justice

This book unravels the implications of profound biodiversity offsetting for nature-society relationships and its links to environmental and social inequality. Drawing on people's resistance against its implementation in several urban and rural places across England, it explores how the production of equivalent natures, the core promise of offsetting, reframes socionatures both discursively and materially transforming places and livelihoods. The book draws on theories and concepts from human geography, political ecology, and Marxist political economy, and aims to shift the trajectory of the current literature on the interplay between offsetting, urbanization and the neoliberal reconstruction of conservation and planning policies in the era following the 2008 financial crash.

Elia Apostolopoulou is a human geographer and a political ecologist with a PhD from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (2009). She has held postdoctoral and lectureship positions in the Universities of Cambridge and Oxford and since 2019 is a Senior Research Fellow in the Cambridge Institute for Sustainability Leadership with a Global Sustainability. Since 2020 she is an editor of Dialogues in Human Geography and in August 2021, she was awarded a 5-year Ramon y Cajal Senior Research Fellowship after ranking 1st in social sciences across Spain. Currently, she is based at ICTA-UAB where she leads the research line Planetary Urban Infrastructures in the Barcelona Lab for Urban Environmental Justice and Sustainability.
