The RUSH Project aims to address the regeneration of urban religious architectural heritage from a systemic perspective through a didactic-laboratory approach. The program adopts a strongly interdisciplinary vision, combining critical insights from various disciplines with interdisciplinary methodologies and both traditional and digital technologies. Involved disciplines: architectural history and restoration | architectural design | technology | urban analysis and surveying | urban sociology.

Methodologies

Field study and analysis of the existing architectural religious heritage in Turin | Lectures and dialogues with experts | Discussion and comparison of topics through seminar activities | Drafting of a project concept based on consultation with stakeholders and local actors | Development of future design scenarios at different scales | Presentation and dissemination of the design concept.

Training activities (in-person)

The in-person training activity is concentrated in 6 days of activities to be carried out in Turin. Planned activities: Guided visit and field inspections of the case study | Expert lectures | Meetings with stakeholders and local actors | Meetings with the local community | Design and lab activities | Social events.

Training activities (online)

Introductory thematic and logistical meeting | Expert lectures | Progress-sharing meetings among students from different schools.

Aims

Students will be invited to envision possible reuse and regeneration strategies for religious heritage from multiple perspectives. Results will be present during the Bip Final Presentation. Disciplinary tutors will be present to support students in their work throughout the lectures and the final presentation.
